Haynes Happenings,

Looking at our world today, it can be easy to be overwhelmed by the unique complexities and challenges of reaching the lost. We're living in a world that changes more rapidly than ever before! Technology is advancing at light speed, people groups continue to migrate towards cities and urban areas where they maintain their own unique language and culture, there are increasing challenges of accessibility, and a slew of other realities from globalization. However, it is precisely because of these realities that I have become convinced that one of the key ways we will see the world reached, is through training and equipping.

Did you know that at any given time there are roughly 800-900 young people training at one of our training centers around the world? While numbers in recent years may be lower in North America, God is raising up a new generation of young people in places like Latin America, Africa, and Asia who have a heart to reach the unreached. We are privileged to find ourselves in a position where we get to participate in training at a time like this. And while training has always been important, and has been a focus of our organization for quite some time, I have never been more excited for training than I am right now!

But what is training and what are the things that someone needs to know in order to reach others? This is a question that could take many, many newsletters to explain thoroughly. But I believe one of the most simple ways to define training is this-training is equipping believers to become more useful to God.

In his letter to his protege, Timothy, Paul states that God is looking for a tool (person) that is useful to Him. (2 Tim. 2:20-26) I believe God can use anyone. He's God! But who is it that God is most often able to use in the life of another person? The one who is useful to Him. The question then is - what makes a person useful to God?

Our training focuses on three key foundations. They are: Bible, Character, and Ministry Skills. We believe each of these foundations is vitally important to the life of the cross-cultural worker. The Bible must be informing all areas of the life of the believer. An individuals character must come into alignment with what they believe to be true about the Bible (though this growth is often not uniform). And a person must know how to approach people, build meaningful friendships, evaluate relationships, and move relationships toward being able to communicate the message of the Gospel. Each of these things is important in seeing a person be used by God in the life of another person.

No matter where an individual may find themselves at when they walk through the doors of our training, we are trusting God to see believers who are made useful to God by being trained and equipped with the Biblical knowledge they need, character that is shaped by the Word, and to see people who are able to take relationships toward meaningful conversations about God and His Word. It is imperative that people be trained in these essentials in their own home culture prior to moving toward the cross-cultural ministry context.

These are some of the goals we have as trainers.

In order to see these goals accomplished, it necessitates that we, as trainers, stay sharp and never give up on learning and growing. For these reasons, our training campus will be hosting a workshop centered on worldview discovery and application in the weeks ahead. Here, we will have people from North America, Latin America, as well as Europe on our campus to collaborate and learn together. This workshop will be centered on discovering the worldview of another, learning more about our own, with a goal of being able to more effectively model what it is we hope to see our training students do one day through developing lessons that speak into a specific worldview.

Along with this, Jared was recently provided an opportunity to sit in on training meetings at Ethnos360 Bible Institute and will be traveling to Colombia in the upcoming months to participate in a training forum there. These are things that God is using in his life at the present time to make us more useful to Him in the task of equipping others to be useful to Him also.

So, as you can see, there is much to trust God with, grow in, and be excited about. And one of the most exciting things we see these days, is our kids becoming more involved in what we're doing here at Ethnos Canada Training. Whether it's mowing grass, watching kids, cleaning bathrooms, or just sitting in on training meetings to listen and learn, we are thankful for kids who are eager to jump in and serve alongside us.

As always, we could never do any of this without people like you who pray, give, and encourage our hearts on a consistent basis. Thank you, for your ministry to us. We are honored and grateful for your investment in our family.
