Hello friends and fellow disciples of Christ! April, 2024 Greetings from the Shalom House classroom! Many things have happened since our last letter.

- Shalom House hosted a Christmas and an Easter event.
- We have had several short-term workers visit to help out with ministry and renovations.
- We continue to host our English conversation classes.
- We put on our very first "Introduction to Soul Care Seminar", with another on the way.
- Completed basic construction in our main areas, and finished the DIY coffee bar!
- We started an Open Art Night for all ages.

Best of all has been watching our Shalom House staff grow together and work as a team. It has been a testament to God's faithfulness, the way he brought us all together with a common purpose, and has been making himself known in our community, and in the ones we interact with.

Christmas was a great opportunity to share with our regular class attendees about the reason for the Holiday. In Japan, Christmas is often considered a romantic holiday akin to Valentine's day, so it is quite a switch in people's perception when they hear about Jesus. We shared cookies, did fun crafts, and just hung out with people from the community.

Our Easter event was a Good Friday contemplative walk through scripture leading up to Jesus' death and burial. This event was focused mostly towards Christians from the Tokyo area who didn't have a Good Friday service or event at their churches. We had things for families to engage with, like scenery, art, props, and interactive experiences. We finished off the evening by taking communion together as a group. Many of said it was a chance to think about the events of Good Friday in a way that they hadn't before.

It was a huge blessing to have several short-term workers come in over the last few months and help out with all the odds-and-ends jobs that can take up so much of the day. Their willingness to help out freed the rest of us up to do some of the tasks more specific to our skills. In preparation for our Intro to Soul Care seminar, we made a huge push to get the building up to our standards. We mudded walls, installed electricity, painted, and manufactured our whole coffee bar cabinet wall out of IKEA dressers and lumber, since Japan does not sell typical kitchen cabinets. Having our class and seminar attendees comment on how cool and comfortable it all turned out is a huge relief, and has us looking forward to how we can continue to improve the space and make it more useable. One task we would love to get some help with is finishing up one of our side rooms as a small counseling room. The more we come across exhausted and hurting people, the more we see the need for a quiet and safe space to talk through things with a listening ear, and a heart towards God.

The highlight of what we've accomplished recently as Shalom House has to be our Intro to Soul Care seminar. We had six attendees total, and almost immediately had to begin planning our second seminar because we had people that wanted to attend, but couldn't due to schedule conflicts. In our first group we had Japanese pastors, church planters, Japanese pastor's wives, missionaries, and Japanese counselors. It was quite the range of people! We held the event in both Japanese and English, thanks to the skills of our Japanese teammate. It was truly an honor to begin walking with them as they slowed down, let go of some unhealthy expectations, and began to practice waiting on God. We are fired up for our next seminar, and eagerly expect God to do some amazing things

Family life is good but chaotic sometimes. We have two daughters who feel things very deeply, which makes for some very passionate dialogue in our house sometimes. One encouraging thing that often comes from this is our recognition of our own shortcomings, is being able to share these moments as growth opportunities for all of us. It's not easy, and it never goes exactly to plan, but it's good to see God growing our girl's understanding of him through our struggles.

We are coming home to NY for a few weeks at the end of July! This will be our first time back in two years. We will have two weeks at our home church, and very limited time.
